

Part 2: Scripture & the Church

Catholics read the Bible too!

...the Church has always venerated <u>the Scriptures</u> as she venerates <u>the Lord's Body</u>.

... The Church never ceases to present to the faithful the bread of life, taken from the <u>one table</u> of <u>God's Word</u> and <u>Christ's Body</u>.

- The Catechism, Paragraph 103

The fourfold Gospel holds a unique place in the Church, as is evident...in the <u>veneration which</u> <u>the liturgy accords it</u>.

- The Catechism, Paragraph 127

The Church "forcefully and specifically exhorts all the Christian faithful... to learn the surpassing knowledge of Jesus Christ, by frequent reading of the divine Scriptures"

Getting ready...

Get a Catholic Bible

Decide what to read

Bible Bingo (Randomly open and read)
Like a novel (Genesis to Revelation)
"Heavy" books (Romans, Revelation, ...)
Gospel of Mark
Epistle of James
Paul's letter to the Philippians
Wisdom Literature: Proverbs, Sirach, Psalms

Decide how much to read at a time

(a) Testament Questions

(b) "End of Time" Questions

(c) Moral Questions

Step 5: Apply To Life
