HOLY WEEK SERVICES

PALM SUNDAY

On Palm Sunday, we celebrate the first joy of the season, as we celebrate Our Lord's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem where He was welcomed by crowds worshiping Him and laying down palm leaves before Him. It also marks the beginning of Holy Week.

Our Masses will begin with the Blessing of Palms, reading of the Gospel, and Procession.

HOLY THURSDAY The Mass of the Lord's Supper 6:00 pm Novus Ordo / 7:00 pm Traditional Mass

The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is referred to as *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. This is where the Church relives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the Priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified. We also recall how Jesus gave us the important example of charity by washing the feet of His apostles. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place until midnight.

GOOD FRIDAY-Service at 2:00 pm 5:30 pm Mass of the Presanctified 12 - 2 pm "The Seven Last Words of Jesus"

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday, it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the Tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the Tabernacle is blown out, and the Tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. Good Friday is a solemn day of prayer and mourning. Good Friday service includes the reading the Passion of Jesus, Solemn Intercessions, Veneration of the Cross, and the reception of Holy Communion.

HOLY SATURDAY-Easter Vigil 8:00 pm

The Easter Vigil is the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church. Beginning in darkness, the Easter candle is lit and the Easter Proclamation is heard. The vigil is divided into four parts: 1) the service of light, 2) the liturgy of the Word, 3) the liturgy of Baptism, and 4) the liturgy of the Eucharist.

EASTER SUNDAY-9:30 am Mass

"Therefore Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities', just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacraments'. St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week'. The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to Him." (CCC #1168, 1169)

SPEND GOOD FRIDAY WITH JESUS

St. James the Less will be commemorating the time Our Lord hung on the Cross with a special program. On April 2nd, we will host a program called *The Three Hours*.

From noon-2pm, it will be centered around The Seven Last Words of Jesus Christ.

Scriptural readings, music and Sacred Silence remembering each of the 7 phrases Jesus spoke from the Cross will give you the opportunity to be there with Jesus and share in His Sorrowful Passion.

From 2pm-3pm, will be the Veneration Service. Come and stay for some or all of these 3 hours as your schedule allows.

Take this unique opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of Our Lord's suffering as we prepare for Him to rise on Easter morning.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17. Lenten regulations are as follows:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

First Confessions will be Wednesday, March 17th, at 6:00 pm. The reception for First Holy Communion will be Sunday, May 9th at the 9:30 am Mass.
